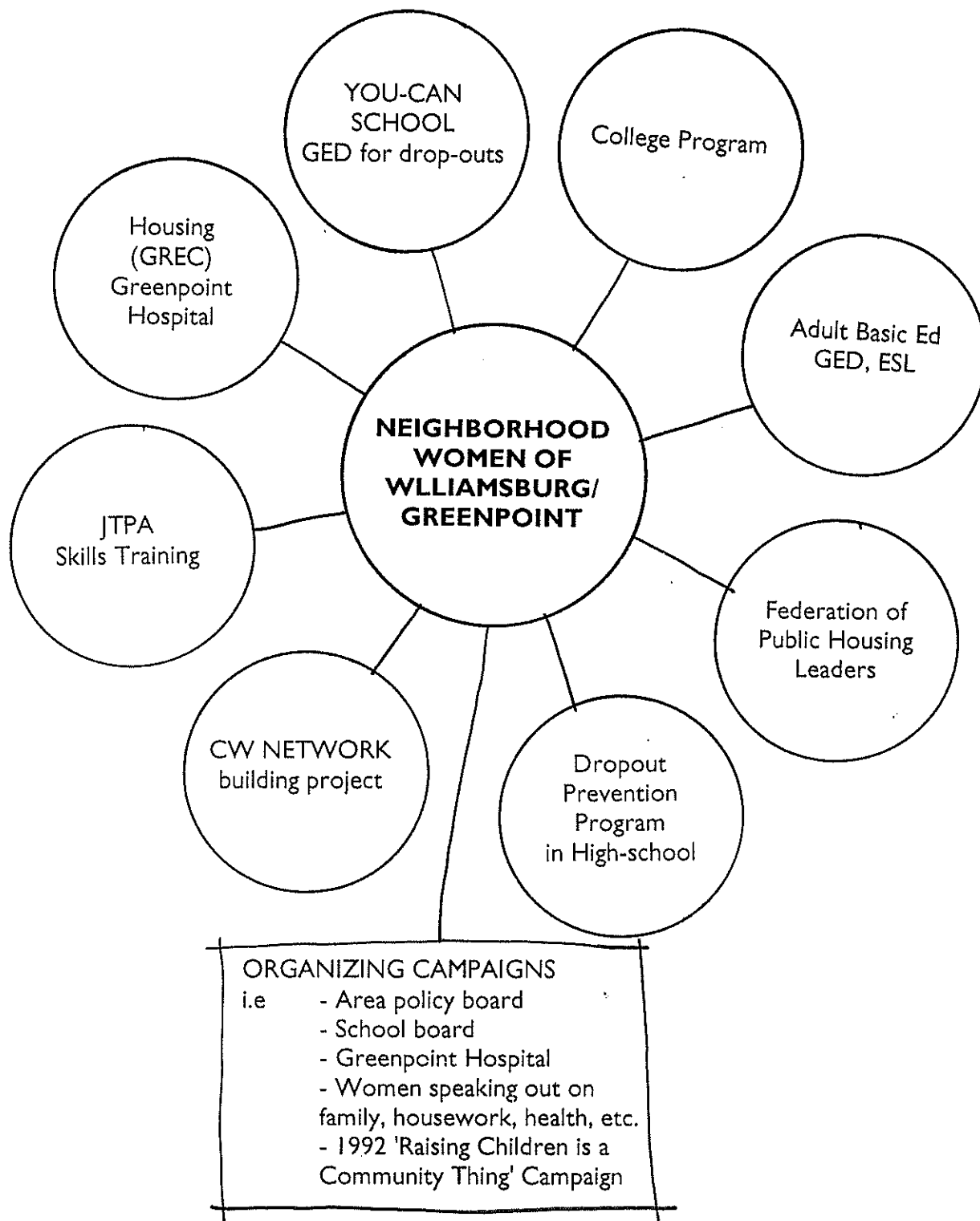

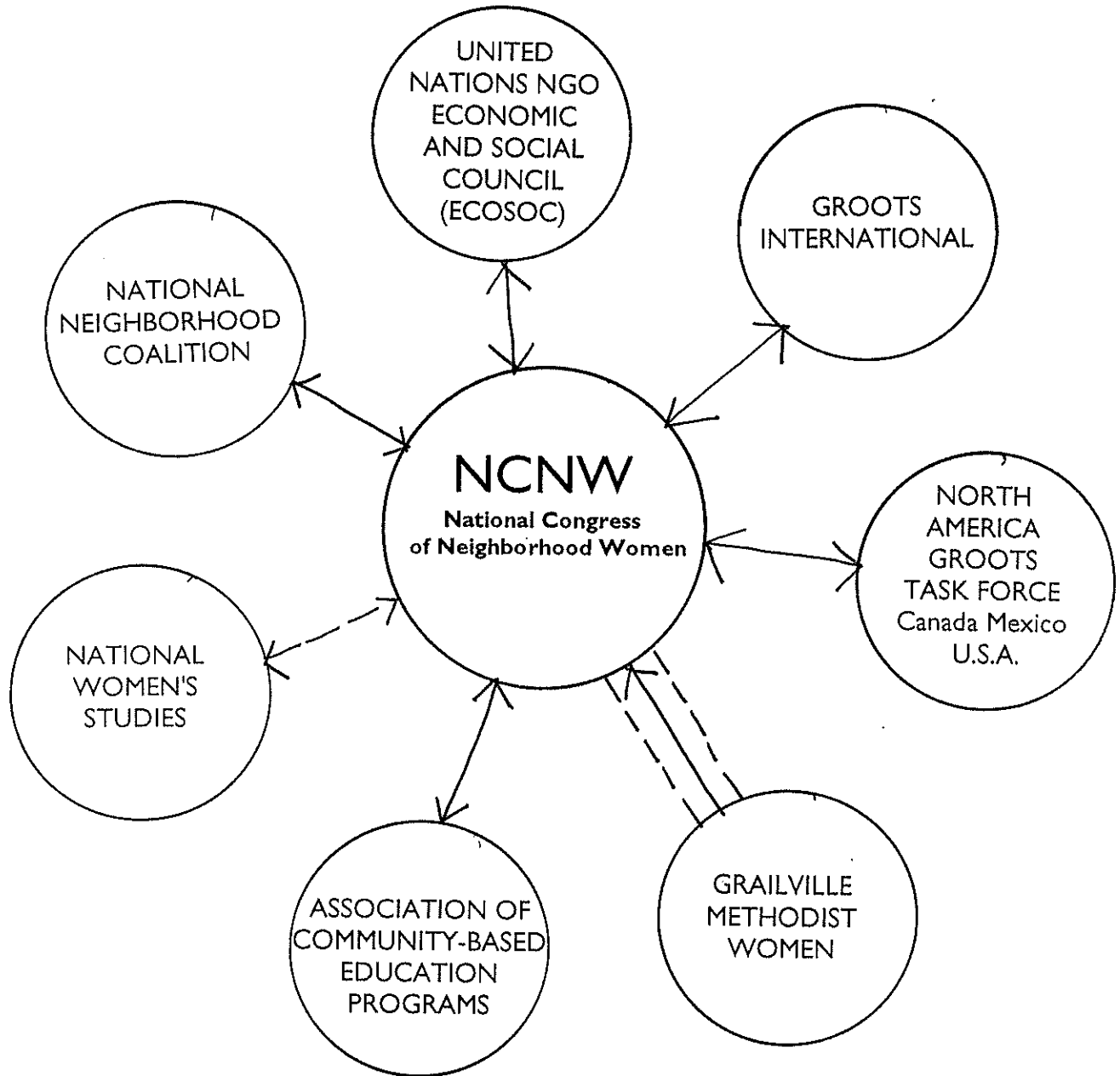

WILLIANSBURG/GREENPOINT RESOURCE STRATEGIES

Critical ones: **The people in the community** willing to work - shared Jan's values,
vision: without them = nothing.

Obstacle: Funder requirements - asked to do too much with too little.
Can't give the intense help needed.

Other critical ones:

CETA funding for salaries.

Donations of furniture.

Ability to raise money in emergencies (rent) from cake/rummage sales.

Federal and state money very important.

Willingness to sue city around discrimination in funding against women -
paid off. Money bought building.

Willingness of staff sometimes to work without salary.

Ways to get city to pay their teachers.

Lobbying legislators.

Need to get people they've helped to contribute money.

Stop taking advantage of volunteers.

Drive people to meetings, give food/cook and serve at meetings.

Often free.
